The GLOPAC welcomed one official each from insurance authorities in 11 countries as its 26th visiting fellows. The fellows explored a wide range of topics related to insurance regulation and supervision from various perspectives. This time, participants came from Indonesia, Thailand, the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Cambodia, Laos, India, Argentina, Kazakhstan, and Saudi Arabia. The GLOPAC of Japan FSA has welcomed 243 visiting fellows from 38 jurisdictions so far.





The fellows met with FSA Commissioner Mr. Ito and Vice Minister for International Affairs Mr. Miyoshi, expressing their gratitude for the opportunity to participate in the program. The eight-business-day program began on August 26 and successfully concluded on September 4.

The program covered a broad spectrum of topics, including Japan's approach to insurance regulation and supervision, climate-related risks such as the natural disaster protection gap, and responses to digitalization. Discussions also included the approaches and challenges faced by the fellows' respective jurisdictions.

A total of 16 lectures were delivered—eight by FSA officials and eight by external experts.In addition to lectures, the program featured group discussions and case study sessions, encouraging fellows to actively think and speak rather than passively listen.

The fellows also had opportunities to experience Japanese culture through Japanese language lessons, calligraphy workshops, and visits to traditional sites such as Asakusa.
